Course objective: Course of lectures given in English aimed at familiarizing students with the main characteristics and aesthetics of postmodernism, with examples from literature and the arts, focusing upon the importance of their iconoclastic, heterodox and playful spirit. The interactive approach is used with a view to improving the students' skills of debating and arguing coherently in English about various aspects of postmodernism.

Course contents: Informing students about the complex and problematic relation between modernism and postmodernism starting from the differences between the two paradigms as they appear in Ihab Hassan's schema. Some lectures will debate postmodernism as a reincorporation of modernism. Some other lectures will introduce the main characteristics and aesthetics of postmodernism, the philosophical and scientific bases of postmodernism, and the main trends in contemporary North American arts.
