Objective of the course: The course is meant: (1) to familiarize masters with the main approaches to the sentence, in modern linguistics, and/or to update knowledge about the phonologic, the morphosyntactic, the semantic and the pragmatic levels of the English sentence; (2) to stimulate analytical, deductive thinking by comparing these trends; (3) to help students acquire the metalanguage and modern methodological principles in approaching the relationship form - function - reality; (4) to theoretically and practically substantiate typicalities of English linguistic structures; (5) to make students realize both the relationships and the interdependence between the English language levels and the similarities as well as the structural and conceptual differences between the English and the Romanian linguistic systems; (6) to enhance the students' capacity to describe and use knowledge about Standard English norms, register, genre and varieties of English

Course contents: The structural, functional and semantic approach to the sentence combines with elements of sentence pragmatics and stylistics, which round out the reflection of reality in language.
