Course title: Poetics and Analysis Techniques of the Literary Text

Course objective: The relationship between two similar notions – *literariness and theatricality*, their definitions and specificity. The relationship *intertextuality* – *intertheatricality*, forms of manifestation in literature and theatre in postmodernism.

Course contents: The analysis of the relationship *literality - literariness*. Seminar: *literariness* as a specific feature of the literary discourse. The non-literary/literary text. The notion of *ambiguity*. The relationship author-text-reader/spectator. The genre, type, register of the literary text. The narrative, descriptive, argumentative text. The dramatic type. The notion of *deixis*. The relation *discours/récit*. Types of discourse. The narration in theatre. The place of the dramatic text. Levels of literary/dramatic text analysis. The six functions of the dramatic language. The text as permutation of texts – *intertextuality, intertheatricality, interludicity* and the theatre postmodernism. Intertext and metatheatre: the technique of "theatre in theatre".
