Course objective: A description of the varieties of French in Canada analyzed both at linguistic level and at the level of non-linguistic external factors (contacts among languages, the status of French, the presence / absence of norm, linguistic policy etc.).

Course contents: I. Varieties of French in Canada. Variation and sources of their characteristics. Description of the linguistic characteristics. Varieties in Québec / Acadia. Convergences and divergences. Factors responsible for these divergences. Types of characteristics. Processes undergone by the popular French. II. The status of the French language in Canada. The linguistic policies in Canada / in Québec. III. Canadian francophonie and francophone minorities. Definition of the concepts of Canadian francophonie, official-language minorities. Canadian francophone minorities. Demolinguistic and sociolinguistic description. Francophone minorities and linguistic policies. French-language education.
