









Orthodox Theology

As a final component of my grade, I got to make a presentation about discrimination in pre-employment selection based on disability, using my own personal example. I also presented the main anti-discrimination institutions in Georgia. This was a great opportunity for me to share some information about my country. Faculty of Mathematics





All students of *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University of Iaşi have access to the University libraries and to other libraries in Iaşi.

Mihai Eminescu Central University Library

Access to the library services is possible based on the entrance permit (which is also valid for all its branches). Permits can be obtained from the Permits Office, in the main Library building, at the ground floor.

2. Internet

Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iasi is an EDUROAM enabled location (a roaming service used in most of the universities from EU countries, but also outside the EU). International students from universities who already have access to EDUROAM should connect to the EDUROAM guest network available in the C5 residence and use the password they have previously set in order to connect. This way, they will get easy access to WiFi (EDUROAM authentication is automatic).

International students who do not use EDUROAM should follow the steps described in our university's internal registration procedure.

(<u>www.uaic.ro/en/international/internet-instructions/</u>).



Given that being granted access may take around 24 hours, you may want to start the registration process before your arrival in lasi. The network configuration step is to be done only after your actual arrival in the C5 residence.

In Gaudeamus Centre for International Exchanges, free-of-charge internet connection is provided in each room via an internet cable.

Almost all faculties have computer rooms, where students have free-of-charge access to Internet. It is possible to use these computers based on your student card.

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3. Medical services

By visiting the on-campus students' medical office, all our Erasmus students can benefit from free-of-charge medical assistance.

Services offered to students may include:

- > medical consultations and therapy:
 - opreventive medicine
 - o curative medicine
- > signing and stamping medical documents:
 - medical certificates
 - o medical certificates for scholarships
 - medical certificates for suspension of studies
- > family planning and counseling:
 - ocontraceptive counseling
 - o special case counseling

4. Meals

Students can cook their own meals (C5 and Gaudeamus Centre for International Exchanges offer facilities for cooking) or eat at the university student cafeteria (*Titu Maiorescu* Canteen). This cafeteria is situated in *Titu Maiorescu* Campus, near the main University building.

Students can enjoy freshly cooked lunches and dinners for about 6 Euros at the student canteen: 15 lei (lunch) + 10 lei (dinner).

There are also other pizzerias and restaurants in the area (including Gaudeamus Restaurant), where prices are a slightly higher.



5. Sports and Leisure

Alexandru Ioan Cuza University has its own Sports Centre (volley-ball, gymnastics, basketball, handball, fitness) and outdoor sport grounds (handball, basketball, football): 3 Toma Cozma Str., Building D of the University, underground floor.

There are also many possibilities in the city to do sport activities (aerobics, swimming, sauna, massage, private fitness clubs, skiing on the Copou Hill during winter time, etc.).



As Erasmus students, even if you are not enrolled at the Faculty of Physical Education and Sports, you can benefit from its sports facilities, completely free-of-charge.

6. Anastasie Fătu Botanical Garden



The Botanical Garden of Iaşi belongs to the patrimony of *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University. It was the first botanical garden in Romania where students could do practical work and research. Since 1963, the Botanical Garden has been located in the north-west of the city, on the western side of the Copou Hill, and has a surface of 100 hectares.

Its scientific activities are developed by two "satellite" botanical gardens, both also belonging to the patrimony of *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University: one in the Carpathian Mountains (at Potoci-Bicaz, District of Neamt) and one at the Black Sea (Agigea, District of Constanta). As Erasmus students of our university, you can visit the Botanical Garden free-of-charge.

7. Facilities for Special Needs Students

Alexandru Ioan Cuza University promotes student equality by providing certain facilities for students with special needs. International students with special needs are invited to contact the International Relations Office (IRO) well in advance, so the necessary arrangements can be made upon arrival. IRO Staff can also refer you to other student services which provide information on educational programmes for people with disabilities and ongoing illnesses.

Counselling

All students may make use of available counselling provided by our Centre for Information and Career Orientation (address: *Titu Maiorescu* Campus, C5 Student Residence, ground floor, rooms 19, 18, 17, 16, 12, 8; *Titu Maiorescu* street, no. 7-9, 700461, laşi; Phone: +40 232 20 1103/ + 4 0 2 3 2 2 0 1 7 7 0; E m a i I: servicii.studenti@uaic.ro) throughout the academic year. The student counselling services are adapted to the individual needs of students facing difficulties.

Practical support

Our University has been constantly improving the accessibility of its premises by installing new elevators, barrier-free accessways in order to have a well-equipped and flexible designed environment for special needs students. Almost all university buildings have elevators, being equipped with handrails and platforms.

Kinetotherapy

The Faculty of Physical Education and Sports supports students with special needs registered at our University. Its specialists in Kinetotherapy and Special Motricity develop both programmes of recovery and programmes of social (re)integration (through therapeutic dance, collective sports adjusted to various disabilities, etc.). If you are interested in one of these activities, you should get in touch with your IRO contact person.



Your Erasmus mobility at UAIC

- all you need to know



Application Procedure and Deadlines

NIVERSIT

At least two months prior to the start of your mobility, you need to get in touch with the Erasmus Office, to submit your application file.

If your home university is located within the EU, your application file consists of the following documents:

- > Passport / National ID card;
- Student Application Form;
- ➤ Learning Agreement Student Mobility for Studies or for Traineeships (depending of the type of mobility you will carry out);
- > Transcript of Records (document issued by your home university, which contains the list of courses and grades which you obtained during the previous year(s) of study);
- Acommodation-Form (to be filled in only if you wish to be accommodated within the university campus).
- The templates can be downloaded from https://www.uaic.ro/en/international/eras mus-programme/erasmus-incoming-students/documents/.
- All these documents need to be sent via e m a i I t o t h e UAIC IRO, a to norica.butnaru@uaic.ro.
 - For fall/full year mobilities, the application deadline is 1 August.
- For spring mobilities, the application deadline is 1 December.

(!) Important

- Don't forget to inform the Erasmus Office on the exact date of your arrival in lasi
- Make sure you know what documents you will be requested when getting back to your home university.
- Don't leave all your arrangements until the last minute!

If your home university is located outside the EU, you need to prepare two sets of application documents.

To submit to your home university:

- > Passport / National ID card;
- > Student Application Form;
- ➤ Learning Agreement Student Mobility for Studies or for Traineeships (depending of the type of mobility you will carry out);
- > Transcript of Records (document issued by your home university, which contains the list of courses and grades which you obtained during the previous year(s) of study);
- > English/French linguistic competence certificate (at least B1 level).

To send via email at norica.butnaru@uaic.ro, at least 10 days before the start of your mobility:

- > Romanian study visa type D/SD (see page 28);
- > Health insurance policy (see page 28);
- Electronic travel ticket;
- Grant Agreement (templates and fill-in instructions to be provided by IRO staff):
- Authorized translation into English of a medical certificate issued by your doctor at home, which must mention that you are not suffering from diseases which endanger public health.

All non-EU citizens who need a temporary residence permit need this medical certifcate.



Academic offer: courses and tutorials



You can consult the full course catalogue for Erasmus students at www.uaic.ro/en/international/erasmus-programme/erasmus-incoming-students/

There is a wide variety of courses, seminars and laboratories available for exchange students. While certain bachelor and master level specializations in some of our faculties are entirely taught in English or French, the language of instruction in other faculties is Romanian.

There's no need to worry if you don't speak Romanian though – the tutorial system is here to save the day. If you join a faculty where all courses are in Romanian, you won't be able to attend lectures in the traditional sense of the word, but you can still undertake an Erasmus study mobility because many of the Romanian courses are doubled up in English, as tutorials.

Tutorials consist of regular and individual meetings with the Erasmus academic coordinator at faculty level and with the professors who usually teach those particular courses in Romanian. International students get guidance and supervision throughout their study mobility in English. They have the possibility to write their assignments and be examined in English and also get to receive direct feedback on their work. For more details on this topic, please get in touch with your Erasmus academic coordinator (see page 36).

How to select your courses and fill in the Learning Agreement

Depending on which of our 15 faculties will host you (it should be counterpart of your home faculty), you should consult the online course catalogue and contact the Erasmus academic coordinator from that faculty (see page 36), to have your Learning Agreement validated and signed on behalf of UAIC, as the receiving institution.





The Learning Agreement must be signed by all three parties (yourself, the representative of your home university and the Erasmus coordinator from your future UAIC host faculty) before the start of mobility and it falls under your own responsibility to obtain all the signatures.

Choosing courses from other faculties

As long as you select at least 51% of your courses from the UAIC host faculty where you will be enrolled, you can also choose courses from any of our other faculties. In order to do so, you need to:

- ➤ Contact the Erasmus academic coordinator from that other faculty, to see what's available for you;
- ➤ Fill in the Request to attend courses from another faculty (see template at page 55)
- Submit the filled-in request to the secretariat of the faculty where where you will NOT be enrolled.

Romanian language course

Each semester, Erasmus students are offered the opportunity to attend a free-of-charge 10-week Romanian language module, amounting to 60 hours of contact hours. No prior knowledge of Romanian is required. Students who are interested in attending this course can add it to their Learning Agreements and, if they pass the final exam, they will receive 5 ECTS credits.

This course is only held if at least 10 Erasmus students are interested.

You will be asked if you want to participate during the orientation meeting (see page 31).

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Study visa and insurance

Study visa

If you are a non-EU citizen, in order to carry out your Erasmus mobility at UAIC, you will have to apply for a Romanian long-stay study visa, type D/SD. You can read more about it here: https://www.mae.ro/en/node/2054

You can read everything you need to know about the application for a Romanian visa on the official E-visa portal: http://eviza.mae.ro/

- For the visa application, you will need your letter of invitation issued by the IRO.
- In order to avoid future problems such as being unable to obtain a residence permit, please do not apply for any other type of visa!
- Given the fact that your visa will be valid for a total number of 90 days and your mobility is planned to last for at least 4 months, you will have to apply for a temporary residence permit at the Immigration Office in Iasi. This document will prolong your legal stay in lasi until the end of your mobility period. More on this topic on page 55.

Insurance

It is very important for you to be properly insured during your period of study or traineeship in Romania. Medical costs can be high, especially if they include a stay in a hospital. Students registered in higher education institutions are not automatically insured against medical expenses. Therefore, you must arrange this yourself.

In case you ever need to access health care services during your period of study or traineeship in Romania, either of the following alternatives would work:

- the European Health Insurance Card (for EU citizens) or
- a private health insurance policy, covering the entire duration of your mobility (for non-EU citizens).

In case you are already here and totally forgot about your health insurance before leaving, you may go to the Local Health Insurance Department (address: Str. Gheorghe Asachi nr. 18-20, 700483 laşi) and apply for an insurance plan.

If your grant is paid by UAIC, please know that...

- You are responsible for buying your travel tickets (both ways) and our university will reimburse a travel unit cost (mentioned in the invitation letter and calculated according to the European distance calculator), upon your arrival in lasi.
- The Erasmus programme does not offer any reimbursement for the internal travel cost or visa fee, these expenses fall under your own financial responsibility.
- The subsistence allowance is calculated for the exact period spent at the university, as mentioned in the Invitation Letter. If your period of stay at our university diminishes (i.e. you arrive later or you leave earlier), your subsistence grant will also diminish.

Travel to lași

If you don't have a direct flight to lasi, your place of arrival in Romania will most likely be Otopeni Airport, near Bucharest. If you won't fly from Bucharest to Iași, you can take a train. You can take a taxi/bus from the airport to the North Railway Station (Gara de Nord) in Bucharest,

from where all the trains to lasi depart.

Several trains depart every day from Bucharest to lasi. The best choice, due to the extra comfort provided, would be the InterCity (IC) train. The trip takes about 6 hours by the InterCity (IC) and about 7 hours by the Rapid (R) or Accelerate (Acc) trains. For information about the train schédule and ticket prices you can visit http://www.infofer.ro.

Tip

It is advisable to take a taxi that is registered by a taxi company and not a private one (even if it bears the label "taxi") from the airport to the railway station.

Leaving the lasi airport area

If you arrive in lasi by plane, the easiest way you can get from the airport directly to the student residence (the C5 residence, if you are a BA or MA student, or Gaudeamus, if you are a PhD student) is by taxi (at a cost of maximum 40 lei/10 euros). As an alternative, you can take the city bus no. 50. You can either download the 24pay app on your phone and purchase your bus ticket by scanning the QR code (the cost of the ticket will be withdrawn directly from your bank account) or you can purchase a physical bus ticket directly from the driver (2.5 lei) and validate it in the yellow validator. One ticket is valid for 120 minutes, which means that you can get on a connecting bus, without having to pay for another ticket. You don't need to re-validate it, but you do need to keep it until you descend. or once the 120 minutes have expired. After you get off at Piata Independentei, remain in the same bus station and get a connecting bus (either no. 28, 36 or 42) and get off at the first bus stop (*Universitate*). From there, you just need to consult the campus map and you will easily find the residence on foot (2 minutes away from C5 / 5 minutes away from Gaudeamus). If you travel to lasi by train, you can get to C5 by taxi for less than 20 lei/5 euros).



Tip

If you reach Bucharest (Otopeni Airport) and you must change planes for lasi, you must pick up your luggage and do the check-in again. Also, it is better to buy your plane ticket from a tourist agency, where you can be advised about the lowest prices and the most convenient flights.

Another possibility to reach lasi is by bus or minibus (autocar or maxi-taxi, in Romanian). There are two companies (*Massaro* and *Teisa*) that organize several bus / minibus trips to lasi every day. They depart from the Otopeni airport area, right near *Arrivals*. The trip takes about 6 hours. Please bear in mind that this option is less advisable if you are travelling with a lot of luggage (more than 2 trolley bags/person).

Important information for non-EU students who will receive their grant from UAIC

Please make sure you keep all your boarding passes, train tickets, minibus tickets etc., because you will have to bring them with you when you visit us at the IRO.

Accommodation **A**



C5 residence Bachelor and Master students

Bachelor and Master students can be accommodated in the C5 student residence (Titu Maiorescu campus). The exact address is 7-9, Titu Maiorescu st, 700461, lași.

- ✓ places are available in triple rooms (fully furnished and equipped with a refrigerator)
- each room has a private bathroom and access to WiFi Internet (see page 21)
- on each floor: a kitchen equipped with gas-stoves and ovens
- accommodation fee: approx. 90 euros/month
- ✓ no down-payment is necessary

Other useful information

- The student residence provides: pillow, duvet, bed sheets, Wi-Fi, fridge, bathroom with shower for each room, kitchen equipped with gas stoves and ovens on each floor.
- ✓ The student residence does not provide: towels, hair dryer, electric kettle, cutlery, plates, pans or pots.
- You will have to pay the monthly accommodation fee after you arrive, when you sign the Accommodation Agreement with the residence administrator. The accommodation fee can be paid by cash or card at the Cashier's office located in the C6 student residence, ground floor.
- You can use the on-campus laundry service in the C7 student residence.

Gaudeamus residence PhD students

You can be accommodated in the **Gaudeamus residence** (Codrescu campus). **The exact address is 1, Codrescu st, 700479, lași.**

- places are available in double rooms (fully furnished, including a TV set and a refrigerator)
- each room has a private bathroom and a little balcony
- access to Internet is also made available (students will need an Internet cable in order to make the connection)
- on each floor: a kitchen equipped with gasstoves and ovens
- ✓accommodation fee: approx. 130 euros/month
- ✓ no down-payment is necessary

Other useful information

- The student residence provides: pillow, duvet, bed sheets, Internet through cable connection, fridge, TV, bathroom with shower for each room, kitchen equipped with gas stoves and ovens on each floor.
- The student residence does not provide: towels, hair dryer, electric kettle, cutlery, plates, pans or pots.
- You will have to pay the monthly accommodation fee after you arrive, when you sign the Accommodation Agreement with the residence administrator.
- You can use the free on-campus laundry service.

Important

- Accommodation booking is done by the International Relations Office (IRO), not individually, by the interested international students. Students express their interest for on-campus accommodation simply by filling in and sending the Acommodation Form at the IRO, together with the rest of the application file.
- > Even if you arrive during the middle of the night, you will receive the key to your room at the reception desk (open 24/7), based on your passport/ national identity document. Once you're checked in, you can enter and leave the dorm whenever you wish.
- > Shortly after you get accommodated, you will have to sign an Accommodation Agreement. For this, you need to present a copy of your passport and a passport-sized photo.


Orientation meeting

Each semester, during the very first day of Erasmus students' mobilities, the International Relations Office organizes an orientation meeting, whose purpose is that of introducing you to the university and the city, but also of discussing various aspects of maximum interest for the proper development of your mobilities at UAIC. It is also during the orientation meeting when students get to express their interest in attending the Romanian language course. There's also a Q&A session, which gives you the opportunity to clarify any concern that you might have, be it academic, administrative or generic in nature. The time and place of the orientation meeting is duly communicated via email.

Initial meeting with your Erasmus academic coordinator

You are advised to write to your Erasmus academic coordinator immediately after you arrive.

- ✓ An initial meeting will be established, during which you will receive guidance on academic issues such as course selection, professors, lecture halls, timetables, etc.
- You will also decide if you need to make any CHANGES to the initial Learning Agreement (within the first 2/3 weeks).



Registration at the Faculty



During the first week after your arrival, you will have to visit the Secretariat of your host Faculty, in order to temporarily enroll as one of the students of our university. Until you do so, you are not technically a student of UAIC. For this mandatory step, you will need:

- > Your passport/national identity card (both in original and copy);
- ➤ A copy of your Learning Agreement, signed by the Erasmus academic coordinators of both your home and host university;
- ➤ A copy of the Transcript of Records issued by your home university;
- > 2 passport-sized photos.

Throughout the entire duration of your Erasmus study mobility, you will have the same rights and obligations as the degree-seeking full-time students of *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University of Iaşi. This includes access to libraries, laboratories, reading rooms, internet facilities.

After registration you receive:

- ➤ a student ID card (carnet de student) that is valid only for your Erasmus study period. The student card may be required in the University or in any other institution where student identity needs to be proven. You may use your student card during the session of exams, when each professor writes down, under signature, the grade you obtained in his/her exam.
- ➤ a public transport permit (legitimaţie de transport) that you can use when you buy tickets for buses and trams. By showing your student travel card you may benefit from a 50% discount. Additionally, based on your student card and permit, you can travel BY TRAIN across Romania, free of charge.



Certificate of arrival / Confirmation of stay

Soon after they arrive in Iaşi, students coming from EU universities will have to visit the IRO, to have their certificates of arrival / confirmations of stay filled in, signed and stamped by the Erasmus contact person. Students must then send the filled-in document back to their home universities, in order to have the first instalment of their Erasmus grants transferred into their bank accounts.

Students coming from non-EU countries won't need a certificate of arrival because the Erasmus grant is transferred by UAIC, not their home universities.



Examinations

Student evaluation is carried out throughout the semester, and also during the exam session, at the end of each semester. Evaluations can take various forms: written or oral examinations, evaluation of the student's activity during the semester and evaluation of individual or collective essays or projects.

Romanian Grading Scale

The Romanian grading scale runs from 1 to 10, and the marks have the following meanings: 1-4 fail, 5-6 sufficient, 7 satisfactory, 8 good, 9 very good, 10 excellent.

Recommended ECTS grades:

1-4=F 8=C 5-6=E 9=B 7=D 10=A



The total number of ECTS credits for one semester is 30 (thirty) and for one academic year is 60 (sixty).

Recognition Procedure

After you return home, the Erasmus mobility you've carried out at UAIC should be academically recognized by your home university. This basically means that the study period you've spent in Romania (including written examinations and/or other forms of assessment) replaces a comparable period of study at your home institution. Academic recognition is done by taking consideration the information specified in the Transcript of Records (ToR) provided by UAIC, which we issue for each Erasmus student within a maximum of five weeks after the end of the mobility. The disciplines mentioned in the ToR should not be different from the courses previously agreed upon in the Learning Agreement. The ECTS credits from your UAIC ToR are then converted to local credits by your home university.

They do so by assessing the contents, learning outcomes and assignments for each discipline you've taken at UAIC. The studies you've carried out in Iaşi should also be specified in your Diploma Supplement, at the end of your study cycle.



I would like to stay longer at UAIC. How can I extend my Erasmus mobility?

If you were initially supposed to stay only for the fall semester at UAIC but you would like to extend your study period until the end of the academic year, there are a couple of simple steps you need to follow. You will have to:

- > obtain the receiving faculty's approval that they agree to host you for another semester here, at UAIC (a simple email from your Erasmus academic coordinator, redirected to the IRO, will suffice);
- ➤ submit to the IRO the filled in (by yourself) and signed (by the home university representative) "mobility extension request" template to be provided by your home university;
- > prepare the Learning Agreement for the spring semester and have it signed by all three parties;
- > submit the new Learning Agreement to the IRO and the secretariat of your UAIC host faculty.

Making changes to the initial Learning Agreement (filling in the *During the mobility* section)

During the first weeks of your mobility, after you've had the initial meeting with your academic coordinator, you might discover that you have to make certain changes to the list of courses from tables A and B of your Learning Agreement. This can happen for a variety of reasons: two or more courses overlap (timetable conflict), certain courses are not available during your study period, etc.

If this is your case, you need to fill in the *During* the mobility section from the Learning Agreement (template provided at page 54)

- Make sure you obtain all three signatures in the *Commitment* table of the *During the mobility* section!
- Once it has been signed by all three parties, please submit a copy to your Erasmus contact person and another copy to the secretariat of your UAIC host faculty.
- Failure to do so means you will receive an incomplete Transcript of Records, so don't skip this step!



Registration for EU citizens at the Immigration Office / Temporary residence permit for non-EU citizens



- If you are an EU citizen who carries out a full-year Erasmus mobility at UAIC, you will have to visit the Immigration Office in Iaşi sometime during the fall semester, in order to get recorded into their database and receive a registration certificate. This requirement is only valid for EU citizens who will stay in Romania for longer than 6 months. All details on the application procedure can be found at page 51.
- If you are an EU citizen and your mobility lasts only one semester, you do not have to visit the Immigration Office at all.
- If you are a non-EU citizen (regardless of whether your home university is located outside or within the EU), after the first 30 to 60 days of your stay in lasi, you will have to visit the Immigration Office and apply for a temporary residence permit. You will need a Romanian study visa type D/SD in order to apply for this document. It is absolutely necessary you obtain the permit because the visa ensures your legal stay in Romania only for the first 90 days of your mobility. The temporary residence permit grants you the right to continue to reside in lasi in full legality, until the end of your mobility. All details on the application procedure can be found at page 53.

At the end of your study mobility

As you get ready to leave laşi and return home, please don't forget about your end-of-stay arrangements.

You will receive the following documents:

- ➤ Transcript of Records from the Erasmus Office (to be issued within a maximum of 5 weeks after the end-date of your mobility. The Transcript of Records is elaborated based on the grade record(s) received by the Erasmus Office from the faculty(ies) where you followed courses and passed exams. The transcript contains the following categories of information: host faculty, disciplines you've attended, grades you've obtained, number of ECTS credits you've collected, Romanian grading scale. 


ESN laşi and their Buddy System

Buddy System

In order to get yourself a Buddy, all you need to do is download the Papaya app on your phone or access the link https://papaya.iter-idea.com/#ESN to create your account. Make sure you select ESN lasi when doing so. Once your account is created, it is very important to subscribe to the Buddy System project and select the International student group. As soon as you get matched with the volunteer with whom you have most things in common, you will be notified. If any kind of problem or doubt related to Papaya arises, feel free to contact ESN at esn.iasi@gmail.com.

In order to stay up to date with ESN's activities, you can join their Facebook group for international Erasmus students, where they post weekly events, trips and all kinds of other fun activities. Your Erasmus contact person from the IRO will send you the link to the group in due time.

Step-by-step checklist



Before your arrival in Iași

- > send your full Erasmus application file via email to the IRO, taking into account the application deadline;
- > carefully plan your stay abroad:
 - make travel arrangements;
 - inform the IRO if you want on-campus housing (fill in the Accommodation Form);
 - apply for a visa, if you are a non-EU citizen;
 - get an insurance plan;
 - get in touch with ESN and look into their Buddy system;
 - study the course catalogue and select the courses you would like to attend at UAIC (table A in the Learning Agreement);
 - get in touch with your academic coordinator, to have your Learning Agreement signed;
- obtain the Certificate of Arrival template from your home university;
- ➤ if you are a non-EU citizen, obtain your medical certificate from your family doctor, which must specify that you don't suffer from diseases which endanger public health;
- ➤ if you have any special needs, inform the IRO in due time.

During your mobility

- > check the info on how to find the student residence;
- sign the Accommodation Agreement at the residence administration;
- > pay for the first month of accommodation;
- > create your internet account and connect to the UAIC network;
- > attend the orientation meeting;
- ➤ if your receive your grant from UAIC, go to the bank indicated by the IRO to open your bank account, visit the IRO to submit your bank statement, bank details, travel tickets, and have your Grant Agreement signed, in original;
- if you receive your grant from your home university, visit the IRO to have your Certificate of Arrival signed and stamped;
- send the filled-in Certificate of Arrival back to your home university;
- attend the initial meeting with your Erasmus academic coordinator;
- start attending courses only after you've had the initial meeting with your coordinator;
- register at the host faculty and obtain your student ID card and public transportation permit;
- ➤ if you select courses from a faculty other than the one where you are enrolled, fill in the Request to select courses from another faculty and submit it to the secretariat of the faculty where you are not enrolled;
- ➤ make changes to the LA, if necessary (within the first 2/3 weeks);


- ➤ submit the Changes to the initial Learning Agreement to the IRO and secretariat of the faculty where you are enrolled;
- > get a library permit, if you need to;
- ➤ if you are a non-EU citizen, visit the oncampus medical office to obtain the medical certificate necessary for the issuance of the temporary residence permit;
- ➤ if you are an EU citizen staying in Iaşi for longer than 6 months, visit the Immigration Office in order to obtain your registration certificate;
- ➤ if you are a non-EU citizen, apply for the temporary residence permit within the first 30 to 60 days since arriving in Iaşi.

At the end of your mobility

- > pay for the final month of accommodation;
- > visit the student residence administration in order to check out from the dorm;
- ➤ have your Certificate of Departure / Confirmation of Stay signed and stamped at the IRO;
- ➤ if you carried out a study mobility, once you receive your Transcript of Records from the IRO, submit it to your home university;
- ➤ if you carried out a traineeship mobility, fill in the After the mobility section from the Learning Agreement and ask your tutor / Erasmus academic coordinator to fill in and sign the Evaluation of the trainee section from the Learning Agreement;
- ➤ ask the IRO to sign any other important document your home university requires.
- At the end of your mobility you will receive a message from the following address replies-will-be-discarded@ec.europa.eu, requesting you to fill in an online questionnaire. Please fill it in carefully, with all due attention, as it is used by the European Commission to evaluate your mobility in laşi.
- After the end date of your mobility, you will receive another questionnaire from the European Commission, regarding the recognition process at your home university.

Climate

The Romanian climate is generally characterized by hot summers and cold winters. In winter, the average temperature is usually between-5°C to -10°C, but it can sometimes go down to -20°C, rarely lower. Cold days may even start from November, so if you come as an Erasmus student in the first semester, be sure to bring along a warm coat and at least one very warm sweater. In summer, days are fairly hot (around +30°C), but temperatures can easily reach +35°C. In the spring and autumn months, temperatures vary between 5°C and 20°C and the weather can be very rainy. If you come as an Erasmus student in the 2nd semester, you may need to bring along some winter clothes (sometimes, winter temperatures only start rising in April), a rain coat for the spring days, and also summer clothes (in some years, the passage from winter to summer is rather abrupt). If possible, you should include these clothing items in your basic wardrobe. Of course, you can also buy them in lasi, where you will find the prices a little bit lower than in your country.

lași attractions

The Palace of Culture

An architectural symbol of the city of laşi, the Palace of Culture was built between 1906 and 1925 on the ruins of the former princely court. The very imposing and beautiful building of the Palace is considered to be the most successful Neo-Gothic architectural creation in Romania and, at the same time, one of the last masterpieces of the Romantic style in Europe.

Nowadays, the Palace of Culture houses four important museums: the History Moldavia, Museum of the Ethnographic Museum of Moldavia, the Art Museum, and the Science and Technology Museum. The most famous room is the Princes' Hall, where visitors can admire the portraits of the most important Moldavian princes and of the Romanian kings (the Hohenzollern Dynasty), painted "medallions". Also, there's a rumour that says that the 365 rooms of the Palace correspond to the number of days in a year.

In the central tower of the Palace of Culture there is a carillon clock, formed of eight bells that play the Romanian Union Song of 1859 (Hora Unirii) every hour.





Vasile Alecsandri National Theatre and Opera House

The National Theatre of laşi was built between 1894-1896 and was inaugurated on December 2nd , 1896. Its rich ornaments, typical of the Baroque style, make it one of the most appreciated architectural Baroque creations in Romania.

The beautiful performance hall, with a capacity of 1,000 places, offers a sense of elegance, intimacy and enchantment, and has very good acoustics. During the First World War, the hall housed the Romanian Parliament sessions (1916-1918). It is also here that opera shows are staged.

In 1957, the theatre was renovated and, on the occasion of the celebration of 140 years from the first theatre show in the Romanian language staged in Iaşi, it was named after Vasile Alecsandri (19th -century playwright).



Traian Hotel

Built in the neoclassical style in 1879 by an engineer, G. Fragneau, who worked with G. Eiffel & Co. in Paris (yes, the Eiffel who designed the Eiffel Tower), the hotel was one of the first in Europe to be molded on a metal frame. Throughout the years, many foreign diplomats and other personalities have stayed at the Traian.

In 1934, Greta Garbo spent some time here in secret during her love affair with John Gilbert.



Central University Library

Located at the base of the Copou Hill, this triangular building with Doric columns and cupola was built between 1930 and 1935, to serve as the headquarters of King Ferdinand's Cultural Foundation. The building was decorated with Carrara marble and Venetian mosaics. By 1945, the Foundation library had become one of the biggest in the country with more than 300,000 volumes. Today, the library is the largest in Moldavia, with a great number of manuscripts and old books dating from the 15th up to the 19th century.



- 6. medical certificate (with the mention: "clinic sanatos");
- 7. a paper folder with fasteners.

- 1. the form will be taken directly from the **General Inspectorate for Immigrations**, **Iaşi**, **Str. Mihai Costachescu nr.6** at the time of the application;
- 2. copies of the following pages from the passport: the one with your photo and personal identification data, the page with the type D visa for studies and the one that was stamped at your (last) entry in Romania;

In order to obtain the residence permit, the applicant will **personally** submit the documents above; a photo of you will be taken by the immigration officer.

The residence permit will be renewed at least 30 days before the expiry of the previous one. The temporary residence right for studies will be extended successively according to the law.

The application for the extension of the residence right will be solved within 30 days from the date of the submission of the documents. If additional verification is necessary, the term for solving the application may be extended by 15 days at the most.




