



REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR EU CITIZENS

Citizens from the European Union member states have the right to enroll to studies in Romania under the same conditions as Romanian citizens, directly to the universities, in accordance with Law no. 199/2023 on National Education, as subsequently amended and supplemented, the Government Decision no. 367/2023 on the approval of the Nomenclature of fields and university specializations / study programs and the structure of higher education institutions for the academic year 2023-2024, as subsequently amended and supplemented, the Order of the Minister of Education no. 3102/2022 of February 8th, 2022 on the organization of admission to bachelor's, master's and doctorate study cycles, as subsequently amended and supplemented and the Regulations of *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University of Iași on the organization of the admission to bachelor's, master's and doctoral study cycles.

Applications for admission to study at *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University of Iași have to comply with the following:

- Files should be submitted to the Secretary Office of the Faculty within the required deadlines;
- Each Faculty Admission Board will assess the compliance with the Faculty and/or study program's entry requirements and accept/reject the applications;
- Registration and the admission exam takes place at the Faculty.

RECOGNITION OF STUDIES

Candidates should have the study diplomas recognized by the Romanian National Centre for Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas (CNRED, <https://cnred.edu.ro/>).

Applications for recognition may be submitted either directly to CNRED or through *Alexandru Ioan Cuza* University, at least 30 days before the admission contest.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

A) Admission to studies in Romanian:

- Attending a full-degree programme in Romanian is conditioned by providing a recognized **Romanian Language Certificate** which may be issued by:
 - a) one of the Romanian universities accredited to offer the *Preparatory Year of Romanian as a foreign language*;
 - b) the Romanian Language Institute or the Romanian Cultural Institute
- Candidates who can prove that **they have attended at least 4 years of study in Romanian** do not need such a certificate.
- If a candidate does not speak Romanian, he/she must attend the courses of the **Preparatory Year (2 semesters)**. During the first semester, international students will study Romanian language for the levels A1-A2. In the second semester, they will continue studying Romanian at an advanced level, focusing on the vocabulary specific to the subject areas chosen by the candidate (Medicine, Sciences, Economy, Law, Humanities). The purpose of the specialized language acquisition module is that of reaching levels B1-B2 by the end of the Preparatory Year.



Should candidates wish to study in a foreign language, they can choose from a list of degrees at Bachelor or Master level that are taught in English, French etc. (please refer to the English version of the university website <https://www.uaic.ro/en/studies/degrees-on-offer-in-english-and-french/>).

B) Admission to studies in foreign languages:

- Attending a full-degree programme in a foreign language is conditioned by passing a linguistic proficiency exam.
- Candidates' language certificates submitted to their application files are assessed by the Commission of Admissions of the respective Faculty. Students who come from countries with the same official language as the one of their chosen study programme or those who provide an internationally recognized certificate of linguistic proficiency equivalent to CEFR level B2 – Upper-Intermediate (e.g. TOEFL, Cambridge, IELTS, DELF B2 or other language certificates as foreseen in the Order no. 5219/2010 issued by the Romanian Ministry of Education) do not need to take the linguistic proficiency exam.
- Candidates who include in their application files a language certificate that is not internationally recognized are admitted on condition that they pass the linguistic proficiency exam before the start of the academic year.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES: BACHELOR (3 years) / THE PREPARATORY YEAR OF ROMANIAN LANGUAGE FOLLOWED BY BACHELOR STUDIES

Documents required:

1. High School Graduation Diploma (Baccalaureate) and Academic Transcript for the high school studies – certified translation in Romanian;
2. Certificate attesting promotion of the Baccalaureate Exam for graduates of the current calendar year – certified translation in Romanian;
3. Certificate issued by CNRED;
4. Birth certificate – certified translation in Romanian;
5. Marriage Certificate or any document indicating the name change – certified translation in Romanian;
6. Passport – copy;
7. Two color photos (format 2/2.5 cm);
8. Medical certificate (issued during the last 6 months) specifying the candidate's health state (i.e., if the candidate is / is not in record with chronic diseases and, if so, enlisting them) – certified translation in Romanian. The candidates for the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport will comply with the specific requirements and submit a medical certificate mentioning that the candidate can take the sports tests, respectively the candidate is medically fit for the field of Physical Education and Sport.
9. Language certificate;
10. Proof of payment of the registration fee, the amount of which may be different, depending on the Faculty where the candidate wants to study. The amount is mentioned on the university website, at the link: <https://admitere.uaic.ro/>
11. Other specific documents that might be required by each Faculty.



POSTGRADUATE STUDIES: MASTER (2 years) / THE PREPARATORY YEAR OF ROMANIAN LANGUAGE FOLLOWED BY MASTER STUDIES

Documents required:

1. High School Graduation Diploma (Baccalaureate) and Academic Transcript for the high school studies – certified translation in Romanian;
2. Graduation Diploma for Bachelor studies and Academic Transcript / Diploma Supplement for BA/BSc studies – certified translation in Romanian;
3. Certificate attesting promotion of the Bachelor's Exam for graduates of the current calendar year – certified translation in Romanian;
4. Certificate issued by CNRED for the High School studies;
5. Certificate issued by CNRED for the Bachelor's studies;
6. Birth certificate – certified translation in Romanian;
7. Marriage Certificate or any document indicating the name change – certified translation in Romanian;
8. Passport – copy;
9. Two color photos (format 2/2.5 cm);
10. Medical certificate (issued during the last 6 months) specifying the candidate's health state (i.e., if the candidate is / is not in record with chronic diseases and, if so, enlisting them) – certified translation in Romanian;
11. Language certificate;
12. Proof of payment of the registration fee, the amount of which may be different, depending on the Faculty where the candidate wants to study. The amount is mentioned on the university website, at the link: <https://admitere.uaic.ro/>
12. Other specific documents that might be required by each Faculty.

Students who apply for recognition of partial studies, in view of continuing their education started in other countries, have to annex certified authorized translation copies of academic transcripts for the completed study years and the corresponding curricula and syllabi.

POSTGRADUATE STUDIES: DOCTORATE (4 years) / THE PREPARATORY YEAR OF ROMANIAN LANGUAGE FOLLOWED BY DOCTORAL STUDIES

Documents required:

1. Written request addressed to the university academic management;
2. Written consent from a potential doctoral supervisor;
3. High School Graduation Diploma (Baccalaureate) and Academic Transcript for the high school studies – certified translation in Romanian;
4. Graduation Diploma for Bachelor studies and Academic Transcript / Diploma Supplement for BA/BSc studies – certified translation in Romanian;
5. Graduation Diploma for Master studies and Academic Transcript / Diploma Supplement for MA studies – certified translation in Romanian;
6. Certificate issued by CNRED for the High School studies;
7. Certificate issued by CNRED for the Bachelor's studies;
8. Certificate issued by CNRED for the Master's studies;
9. Birth Certificate – certified translation in Romanian;
10. Marriage Certificate or any document indicating the name change – certified translation in Romanian;
11. Passport – copy;



12. Language Certificate;
13. Curriculum vitae;
14. List of published scientific papers;
15. Proof of payment of the registration fee, the amount of which may be different, depending on the Doctoral School where the candidate wants to study. The amount is mentioned on the university website, at the link: <https://admitere.uaic.ro/>
16. Other specific documents that might be required by each Doctoral School.

In order to be accepted, candidates for a doctoral degree have to pass the admission exam organized according to the calendar set by each Doctoral School.
